U.S. CONGRESSMAN GRESHAM BARRETT, CANDIDATE FOR GOVERNOR, TO SPEAK DEC. 3

Rep. Gresham Barrett, from the third congressional district, and a candidate for governor, will be our guest speaker Dec. 3.

Rep. Barrett was born and raised in Westminster, and his parents instilled in him the conservative values he carries with him today — faith in God, service to others, hard work, devotion to family, love of country, individual freedom and personal responsibility.

Barrett earned a bachelors degree from The Citadel, and after graduation, he served four and a half years in the army — First Cavalry Division, Fort Hood, Texas. In 1987, Gresham returned to West-

minster to help run the family furniture store.

First elected to the State House of Representatives in 1996, Gresham led the successful fight to ban partial birth abortion in South Carolina and stood up for the rights of taxpayers.

For his work in the U.S. Congress, the American Conservative Union gave Gresham their second-highest conservative score, while *National Journal* ranked him the fourth most conservative member of the U.S. House. Gresham has repeatedly earned the endorsements of the National Rifle Association, the National Federation of Independent Businesses and the National Right to Life Committee. The National Taxpayers Union has repeatedly named Gresham Barrett a Taxpayer's Friend.

Gresham and his wife Natalie have three children — Madison, Jeb and Ross.

About Our GCRWC Family Mary Earle Drawdy: a Historical Heritage

Mary Earle Drawdy is a 10th generation Earle and is a descendant of Col. Elias Earle. Col. Earle was a member of the South Carolina House of Representatives from 1794 to 1798, the South Carolina Senate 1798-1804 and a U.S. Congressman in 1805-07, 1811-15 and 1817-21. The Earle family was among the first settlers of Greenville.

Mary grew up in Greenville and attended Greenville High School. She is a graduate of Furman University and earned a B.A. in French. After graduation she worked for the Navy Department in Washington for two years and then married. Thereafter, she became a homemaker and mother and worked various jobs including medical secretary and substitute teacher.

Mary is a charter member of Greenville Republican Women's Club. She grew up a Republican and her entire family is Republican. She

was married to Vance B. Drawdy, who was instrumental in getting the Republican Party established in South Carolina. Mr. Drawdy was an attorney and partner in the Horton Drawdy Ward & Jenkins law firm.

Mary has one son, Vance Earle Drawdy, who is an at-

torney and partner in the Ogletree, Deakins, Nash, Smoak and Stewart law firm. Vance is married to **Sarah Ganss Drawdy**, also an attorney, who has her own law firm in Anderson. Sarah is also a member of GCRW.

Mary has other family members who are members of GCRW, her sister, **Elizabeth Farnsworth**, sisterin-law **Pat Earle** and her niece **Jenny Earle**.

Mary was a charter member of the Legal Auxiliary, which has recently disbanded. One of the purposes of the Auxiliary was to educate children regarding safety at home and in the streets. The group visited schools and performed skits that the children could relate to. The nationally recognized program was HouseWise/StreetWise.

Mary is also a member of the Greenville Historical Society and the South Carolina Genealogy Society. She is an accomplished portrait artist, having exhibited pictures in the Poinsett Club

Art Show. She has studied with Bob Bruns and is currently studying with Janet Fleming Smith. Most of her portraits are of family members and occasionally friends.

She is co-chair of the Mamie Eisenhower Library Project and a member of First Baptist Church. *Karen Crane*.
