


## HOPE IN TIME OF DESPAIR

## Legislative Corner Who Is in For Governor 2010?

So far here is a list of rumored and declared candidates.

**Rep. Gresham Barrett** is well-known in the Upstate and third congressional district for his conservative voting record and outstanding constituent service. He may face wary supporters over his vote on the bailout.



**State Attorney General Henry McMaster** is former chairman of the state Republican Party and is well known and liked in GOP circles. He has proven to be adept at raising money, but he may face some opposition for his tendency to use his office to chase after publicity seeking issues.

**Lt. Gov. Andre Bauer** is a younger face in the Republican Party. While he is known for his conservative stands and as a hard worker on the campaign trail, he will have to work to overcome those who have reservations (prompted by prior speeding incidents) about his readiness to take over as chief executive of the state.

**State Sen. Larry Grooms** is a consistent conservative and one of the handful of voices to speak out against waste in the SC Senate. While he also is a known social conservative, he faces the challenge of competing with those who already have broader name recognition (and bigger bank accounts)

**State Rep. Nikki Haley** stands out as the only woman and only SC House member to enter the race so far. Haley has been a champion of transparency and accountability during her short career as a legislator. She faces similar challenges to Sen. Grooms in name recognition and fundraising.

**Dr. Brent Nelsen** is a Chair of the Political Science Department at Furman University. He has proven to be a good speaker on the stump and to be well-versed in the issues, however, he has an uphill battle since he is running for the highest office in the state as a relatively unknown candidate without any former political experience.
